Last month, we shared an update of our new gazebo. Since then, as planned, we had the surrounding landscape cleared so we have a "clean slate" for spring landscaping. Thanks to the Beautification Committee for overseeing this work!

This committee is also bidding out the new landscaping. They will work with the suppliers to solidify options and then make a recommendation to the board for contracting.

The plan is to landscape early in the spring, so we do NOT disrupt next summer's activities.

BHP Board Updates

The board has wasted no time in jumping in to tackle critical initiatives. Many contracts are being rebid and renegotiated. We are working closely with our Capital and Finance Committees on this initiative.

We are bidding out landscape maintenance for the next three years. This is one of our largest annual expenditures and we are considering several suppliers that bid on the work. While looking for lower cost solutions, we also want to be sure that the services are of high quality, a challenge for a complex of our size.

We are finalizing contracting and planning for 2024 snow removal, house painting, and the remaining driveway replacements.

We are considering a contract to replace road signs to match the entrances. This is part of our continuing plan to update the look throughout our complex.

Lastly, we are reviewing our building insurance to ensure we have the best coverage for the cost.

These initiatives are being fed into our new 2024 budget which we will share in December.

Housekeeping Reminders

Parking - Visitor parking areas should not be used overnight by homeowners except when driveways are being repaired, plowed, or during remodeling. Guests should use designated visitor parking or personal driveways. No one should park on our streets overnight due to fire codes. This reminder becomes more critical during the winter when plows must get through the complex.

Salt - With the cold weather comes the need to salt. Just a reminder that this is a condo insurance safety requirement so please do not dispute the use of salt in front of your home. Please take care around these slippery areas!

Paint - If you have experienced any issues with painting that was done over the summer, feel free to submit a maintenance request but know that the work will not be scheduled until the spring.

Trash Pickup!



Pickup of trash is scheduled for Wednesdays each week with certain holidays moving collection one day later. Recycling pickup is provided on every other Friday. Yard waste is picked up on alternating Wednesdays during the season. Bulk waste is collected, for a fee.

Trash containers should be placed outside after 6 PM the evening prior to pick up and put back before dusk the day of pickup. Trash inside containers should be enclosed in bags, covered by a secure lid to preclude animal and wind disturbance, and placed at curbside on a paved area. Tied trash bags may only be left outside the morning of scheduled pickup. If you must put out garbage for pickup without a container, please use construction type bags so animals and birds don't rip the kitchen bags and spread garbage all over. This has been a recent problem across the complex, so we appreciate your help.
